GLOSSARY OF TERMS

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| Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC) | Public or private, non-profit community-based health care organizations, which provide comprehensive preventive and primary health care services in medically underserved communities and to medically underserved populations. |
| State-Children’s Health Insurance Program (S-CHIP) | Enacted by the U.S. Congress in August 1997, the State-Children’s Health Insurance Program (S-CHIP) is designed primarily to help children in working families with incomes too high to qualify for Medicaid but too low to afford private family coverage. Under the S-CHIP program, states can choose to expand Medicaid coverage, or create separate children’s insurance programs, or design programs that are a combination of expanded Medicaid coverage and separate programs. |
| School-Based Health Center | A health center located in a school or on school grounds that provides comprehensive primary and preventive health care services. SBHC’s are authorized under state or local law to furnish medical and health services to children in schools or educational settings and organized, sponsored, or supported by school districts, school cooperatives, or other educational institution or entity. |
| School-Linked- Health Center | A health center located outside of the school that has a formal referral affiliation with a school to provide students with comprehensive primary and preventive health care services. |
| Primary Care Providers: | Medical Doctor (MD) Physician Assistant (PA) Nurse Practitioner (NP) |
| Mental Health Therapist: | Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) Psychologist Psychiatric Nurse (PN) |

GLOSSARY OF TERMS CONT'D

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| Basic Preventive Health Services | A health center provides basic health education, health promotion, disease screenings, or other preventive services in the school setting, but not comprehensive primary health care. |
| Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) | According to Section 1905(1)(2)(B) of the Social Security Act: (1) an organization funded under section 330 of the Public Health Service Act (i.e., a consolidated health center); or (2) an organization that the Secretary determines meets the requirements for funding under section 330 (i.e., An FQHC look-alike). |
