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

Project Description

Family Health Centers, Inc. a federally qualified community health center, provides primary health care and outreach services to persons who are homeless in Louisville and the surrounding areas. The Phoenix Health Center is the home for the primary health care clinic and the base of operations for outreach services. Primary care is also provided in five homeless shelters serving women and children.

Services

The Phoenix Health Center, located just east of Louisville's central business district, provides health care and outreach services to men, women, and children who are homeless. The health clinic operates from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. five days a week. The clinic staff includes two nurse practitioners, one full-time physician, three medical assistants, and three front office workers. Services include adult medicine, pediatrics, TB testing, HIV counseling and testing, mental health, laboratory, medications, referrals, and transportation. The dental clinic operates three days per week, and the staff includes a part-time dentist, part-time hygienist, full-time dental assistant, volunteer dentists, and dental students. Health outreach is provided onsite at five shelters that serve women and children. Health outreach staff consists of a nurse practitioner and a medical assistant. Mental health treatment is provided three days per week through a SAMHSA grant. Mental health staff include a social worker, psychiatric nurse practitioner, and a psychiatrist. Social services provide outreach and case management to disabled adults who are homeless. Two HUD funded social services workers provide substance abuse counseling, referral, and case management. A HUD funded child advocate provides outreach and case management with families whose children have special needs. Inpatient substance abuse treatment and mental health counseling are provided offsite through HUD funding.

Linkages

Essential linkages have been established with various community agencies. The local community mental health center provides three mental health workers onsite at the Phoenix Health Center who provide outreach and case management services to individuals who are homeless. Patients needing specialized medical services are referred to the University of Louisville's health care clinics for further treatment. Other linkages include Jefferson Alcohol and Substance Abuse Center, Family and Children's Counseling Services, Jefferson County Medical Society, Kent School of Social Work, Spalding University, Legal Aid, Coalition for the Homeless, City of Louisville, Jefferson County Division of Community Development, and local shelters and homeless service providers.



Project Description

Hazard Perry Health Care for the Homeless is a partnership providing outreach, housing, and access to health care for people who are homeless in eastern Kentucky. Primary care is provided through contracts with clinics, volunteer physician networks, and onsite at area shelters.

Services

Primary care is available at Little Flower Clinic and Clover Fork Clinic. Referrals are made for specialty and inpatient care. Lab and ancillary services are available onsite. Pharmacy is coordinated through the Southeast Kentucky Community Access Program. Mental health and substance abuse treatment are provided through Kentucky River Community Care and Cumberland River Comprehensive Care.

Linkages

Hazard Perry HCH has linkages with the following agencies: Corner Haven Crisis Center, Christ's Hands Shelter, Kentucky River Community Care, Cumberland Valley Comprehensive Care, Starland Daycare, Kentucky River District Health Department, Harlan County Health Department, Appalachian Regional Healthcare Hospitals, Hazard Perry County Housing Development Alliance, University of Kentucky Center for Rural Health, and COAP.



Project Description

The Lexington-Fayette County Health Department Primary Care Center provides services to persons who are homeless through a joint effort of the University of Kentucky College of Nursing, HOPE Center, Comprehensive Care Center, and the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department.

Services

Health care is provided at Hope Center, located in the downtown area where people who are homeless congregate. The clinic is open Monday through Friday and is staffed by mid-level practitioners. Services include diagnosis and treatment of medical conditions, lab tests, x-rays, basic medications, referral for substance abuse and mental health, and social services/case management to assist in accessing entitlement programs and in meeting basic needs. Outreach services provide health education and wellness education.

Linkages

Access to emergency health care, mental health services and inpatient hospital care is facilitated through the Health Department Primary Care Center's existing network. In addition to the collaborative effort in providing primary care, clients can be referred through cooperative arrangements for specialist care including dental, ophthalmologic, mental health counseling, personal needs, and other social services.
