

How?

- <u>HeatRisk Forecast Tool</u> tells you when temperatures may reach levels that could harm your health
- <u>HeatRisk Dashboard</u> gives personalized heat forecast information for your location and protective actions to take
- <u>CDC clinical guidance</u> helps clinicians keep at-risk individuals safe when temperatures rise

Why?

- Heat can harm physical and mental health.
- Warmer temperatures can contribute to unhealthy air quality.
- Making a heat action plan with your patient can help them stay safe on hot days.




